Cameroon is making a significant push for green energy by waiving over CFA9 billion (approximately USD 15.5 million) in customs duties and taxes for renewable energy projects.

The foundation of Cameroon's solar incentive structure lies in the exoneration of VAT (0%) on solar and wind equipment/materials, a measure adopted through the 2012 Finance Law.
