Pure deionized water must be used to clean photovoltaic panels. Deionized pure water is free from dissolved substances in the water. Unlike solutions (Acidic, Basic, Alcohol), deionized pure water ...

Spraying cold water directly onto these hot panels can cause thermal shock. As a result, it may lead to glass cracking which is potentially fatal and irreversible failure.

Solar farms rarely have a need to clean the panels as the rain is usually sufficient, even in the driest regions. When they clean, they use gentle techniques and avoid harsh chemicals, ...

It is worth using clean, preferably demineralized water for washing. Tap water can leave a residue on the surface of the panels, which will reduce their efficiency over time.

While some suggest that regularly washing panels is necessary to get the maximum solar conversion possible. Others feel that solar panels should only get a rinse off once in a while if you ...
