The station was part of the Allied Command Europe Highband (ACE High), a NATO radiocommunication and early warning system that was operational between 1965 and 1995.

On the highest mountain massif in northern Sardinia, a formerly secret US military base is located. In the past, locals have told many rumors and stories about this place which have endured ...

The NATO station IDGZ was a central node in the chain of maximum security military radio communications between Europe and America. The signals also included 5 encrypted telephone ...

This station is equipped with tropospheric scatter station equipment, line-of-sight microwave, and STC multiplex equipment to convert radio signals to speech and telegraphic communications.
